THE AUTONOMY OF THE CHURCH IN THE RECENT CASE LAW OF THE EUROPEAN COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS

The purpose of this seminar is to make an inventory of the recent jurisprudence of the European Court of Human Rights on the protection of the internal freedom enjoyed by the churches in their relationship with their religious members and employees. This issue has become particularly important; in recent months, the Court issued a dozen judgments specifying the applicable case law principles. The U.S. Supreme-Court has also ruled on the matter recently, also reaffirming the principle of church autonomy.

This seminar will also discuss the issues caused by the case *Sindicatul "Păstorul cel Bun" c. Romania* (Third Section, January 31, 2012, No. 2330/09) and the reasons for a potential referral to the Grand Chamber.
